

Nuno Manuel Félix graduated from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Lisbon in 1999. He traveled to the United Kingdom to perform an internship in Small Animal Medicine at the Animal Medical Center, in Manchester, under the supervision of Dr. Phillip Boydell. After returning to Portugal and working in several private hospitals, he joined the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Lisbon in 2001, where he remained until 2014. At the University, Nuno worked as an Assistant Professor in several disciplines and as a clinician at Hospital Escolar Veterinário-FMV, as a resident physician and responsible for the Emergency and Critical Care section. In 2004 he completed his Master's Degree in Neuroscience, at the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Lisbon and in 2011, he obtained an Integrated Master's Degree in Medicine from the same University. In 2017 he completed his doctoral thesis on hemorrhagic shock at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Lisbon. Nuno finished the Pediatric Medicine residence in July 2020 and currently works in Hospital Santa Maria in Lisbon and in Hospital Garcia da Orta in Almada. He is also an external lecturer for Faculty of Medicine of the University of Lisbon, giving classes in pediatric emergency medicine. Nuno was actively involved in the development of Emergency Veterinary Medicine and Intensive Care at national and European level, having performed the functions of Secretary of the European Society for Emergency and Intensive Veterinary Care (EVECCS) 2005 -2011. Currently holds the position of Chairman of the Member and Relationship Committee of EVECCS. He is also one of the founding elements of the Portuguese national group for emergency and veterinary intensive care. Nuno is also a national and international lecturer, having written several articles and book chapters, as well as guiding several master's theses in Veterinary Medicine related to Emergency Veterinary Medicine and Intensive Care.
