Advanced oxygen delivery method: NIV of High flow oxygen? What do you prefer?

High flow oxygen therapy and non-invasive ventilation techniques as CPAP have gain in interest in veterinary medicine for patients non-responsive to conventional oxygen therapy. This lecture will be co-delivered by 2 speakers with different experience with HFOT and NIV, and will give pro, cons physiological benefits, technical points, prognosis and give some tricks for the use of these 2 techniques.

Abdominal POCUS: Basics in the unstable patient

POCUS is defined as focused real-time ultrasonography brought to the patient, performed by the attending clinician in conjunction with the clinical exam, to answer specific questions (often binary), or to guide interventions. Abdominal POCUS is indicated in the unstable patient as it will help the clinician to detect or follow abdominal abnormalities before clinical expression. This lecture will describe abdominal POCUS technique and explain how to assess variety of conditions leading that can be found in unstable patient as abdominal effusion, ileus/dilated stomach and evaluation of volemia.
